How-to:

- 1 This style looks better on second-day hair. To give strands extra grip, spritz a dry shampoo or texturing dust to the roots of dry hair.
- 2 Using a paddle brush, smooth hair away from the face and gather into a low ponytail at the nape of the neck and secure with an elastic.
- 3 Twist the tail to create a bun; pin it in place. If you have fine hair, backcomb sections of your ponytail to create a voluminous, textured chignon.
- 4 Aim for imperfection: if your knot is too neat, "pull out a few strands using your fingers", suggests Overton.
- 5 Mist with a matt finishing spray to secure your style.
