

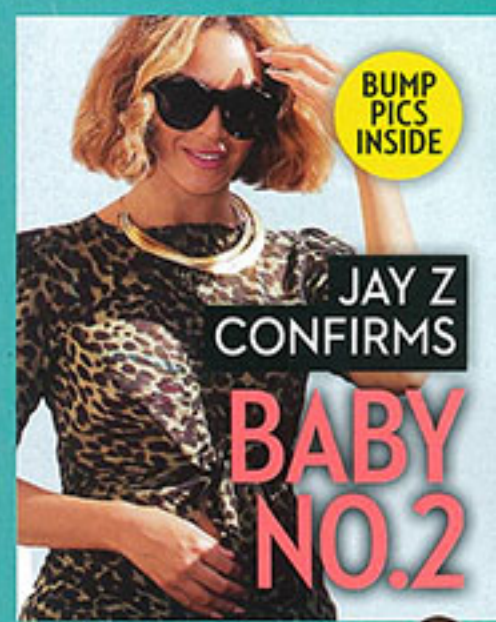


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INSIDE HARPER'S WORLD

Roughing it has never looked so good! Here's how to tousle those tresses...

TEXTURE



TOUSLED BEACH TEXTURE

Add edge to beach waves with a collarbone-grazing bob and a fringe to frame your face.

STEP 1: 'Start with a volumising shampoo and conditioner and a styling product that will hold curl,' says Tanya Nelson, national educator for Dateline Imports.

STEP 2: Flip head upside down and blowdry using a diffuser (on a low speed so you have control), moving in sections, drying upwards.

STEP 3: 'Add texture with sea salt spray while you're drying. Curl with tongs, starting underneath and working your way up around your head.' Pull fingers through your hair and tousle curls for textured waves like Taylor's.

HOLLYWOOD GLAMOUR

The hottest way to make old Hollywood glam new is to add texture. Kylie's perfected the look with a deep side part and a big blowdry that's been brushed out and roughed up.

STEP 1: 'Start with smoothing shampoo and conditioner and a volumising mousse on towel-dried, damp hair,' says Tanya.

STEP 2: 'Dry using a round brush to smooth. For a bigger blowdry, place hot rollers in large sections of hair. Lightly hairspray and leave in until cool - this is what sets the curl.'

STEP 3: 'Brush out with a cushion brush for that Hollywood glamour wave.' Finally, make like Kylie and shake it up to make it modern.

WET-LOOK LOCKS

For flattering, fresh texture, try wet-look locks contrasted with piecey, straight strands.

STEP 1: 'Starting with damp hair and using a gel or strong-hold mousse, push hair back with your fingers and set by following with a hairdryer,' says Tanya.

STEP 2: 'Keep the blowdryer tight against your head, on a low speed and a medium-high heat and once set, hold it in place while you style remaining hair.'

STEP 3: Finish with hairspray and don't forget to protect your locks. 'Use an oil-based heat defence as it also pushes moisture out, speeding up your drying time,' adds Tanya.
