A SHINE SPRAY

"Heavy serums can drag hair down, making it look oily, so add a little sheen with a spray instead," says Nader. Spritz onto palms, then lightly comb fingers through your ends for a hint of shine.

AN ANTI-DANDRUFF SHAMPOO

Even if you don't have a flaky scalp, have a bottle of it on hand for times when you need a *thorough* cleanse. Styling products are deceptively clingy, so switch up your regular shampoo every other week and keep strands free of build-up.

A DETANGLER

It's a welcome hit of hydration for locks sapped by wind, sun and air-conditioning – a quick mist will help you comb out knots in no time. Look for ingredients like macadamia seed and argan oil, which help to seal the hair cuticle and lock in moisture.

AN IONIC HAIRDRYER

It'll dry hair from the inside out, which is faster and less damaging. Detachable nozzles are great for creating different looks – a diffuser will help create loose waves. Look for one with a cold shot to give you shampoo-ad shimmer.

EYESHADOW 2.0

Once a disco dancefloor hit, two-toned eyes are back. Here's how to make it more modern, less '80s redux. BY LISA PATULNY

Step 1: Prime

Why waste your time crafting a make-up masterpiece only to have it slide off by the second round of drinks? "If you're going for drama, you want it to last as long as possible. Eyeshadow primer helps colour stick to your lids," says make-up artist Fern Madden. TRY: Napoleon Perdis Eye Will Survive Primer, \$35, 1800 814 572, napoleonperdis.com.

Tip: Using rainbow shades on your eyes can draw attention to dark shadows. Make like you've had your eight hours and dab a little concealer underneath to even out tone.

Step 2: Apply

Use a firm-bristled brush (it'll prevent shadow fall-out) to apply the lighter shades, starting from the inside of your eye until you hit halfway. Then apply the second colour onto the outer edge and into the socket until the colours just overlap. Smudge a little shadow under your eye, to balance the look. TRY: M.A.C 252 Large Shader Brush, \$56, 1800 613 828, maccosmetics.com.au.

Tip: Keep the rest of your make-up low-key or risk being mistaken for a David Bowie impersonator. Go for a dewy base like Bobbi Brown SPF 15 Tinted Moisturizer Oil Free, \$70, 1800 304 283, bobbibrown.com.au, to keep it modern.

Step 3: Blend

"A great two-tone eye is all about blending – harsh lines are not flattering on anyone," says Madden. Use a shading brush for the best result; it'll help to blur the edges of the shadow. Smudge the line between the two colours, as well as outer edges. TRY: Illamasqua Blending Brush 1, \$60, 1800 661 210.

Tip: Not sure what colours to choose? Your infest bed is keeping it tonal.

Step 4: Line

By day, use a shimmer-free liner in the darker of the two colours to line your entire eye, and keep glitzy types for amped-up eyes at night. TRY: Max Factor Liquid Effect Pencil Eye Liner in Violet Voltage, \$18.95, 1800 181 040.

Tip: Avoid lining inside the rim – it can make eyes appear smaller.

Step 5: Define

Pump up newly bright eyes with a swipe of black mascara for definition – choose a formula you can build. For an all-out party look, try a coloured version. "Shades like electric blue and purple make eyes pop," says Madden. TRY: Rimmel London Extra Wow Lash Mascara, \$12.95, 1800 812 663.

Tip: Colourful eyes put the focus on your brows, so make sure they're in good shape. Fill in any patches, then set with a gel like Tweezerman BrowMousse, from \$26.95, 1800 251 215.
