Get it on Stay subtle with coloured ends or select streaks



STEP 1 After protecting your clothing, grab your product of choice. We chose a pink hair chalk for good coverage and easy application. Run the chalk around your hair down from your mid-lengths

to your tips until you've achieved perfect coverage. STEP 2 Lock in the colour until your next shampoo by spritzing well with a medium-hold hairspray and you're done.
